#### **DEFINTIONS**



For the purposes of this paper the following words shall have the following

definitions and meanings when referenced in this paper.

**Assistance Resource Center (ARC):** A large space/building that houses jobs services, housing, education, substance abuse treatment and government agencies all in one place.

**Chronically Homeless:** Unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition who has either been: A: Continuously/Nonstop homeless for a year or more. B: Homeless on four (4) separate occasions in the last three (3) years for three (3) continuous plus (+) months each. C: Total combined homeless time is greater than twelve (12) months in the last four (4) years.

**Continuum of Care (COC):** Local planning body responsible for coordinating a full range of homeless services in a geographic area as directed by The US Dept of Housing & Urban Development (HUD's) 1994 initiative. **Couch Surfing:** Temporary stay in a series of other people's homes/businesses making use of improvised/unplanned sleeping arrangements without permeant/usual sleeping quarters in a habitable and livable structure.

**Crossroads Mall:** An abandoned shopping mall in Oklahoma City with over one million (1,000,000) square feet located at the northeast corner (7000 Crossroads Mall Dr. Oklahoma City, OK, 73149) of the I35 & I240 Intersection. This site will serve as a proposed ARC in this proposal.

**Curbside Chronicle:** An organization in Oklahoma City that helps the homeless obtain jobs, make a basic income to survive and generate work history. To learn more about them visit their website at <a href="https://thecurbsidechronicle.org/">https://thecurbsidechronicle.org/</a>

**Educational Standard Goal (ESG):** A: Obtaining High School Diploma OR GED for the homeless that haven't obtained one already. B: Providing Associate Degree, Job Skills training and or Vocational Training/Placement for those who have already obtained a GED/High School Degree.

**Emergency Shelter:** Short-term lodging for people experiencing a housing crisis and extra bed availability during extremely bad weather.

**Employment Stability:** The ability and state for people to keep steady and regular employment.

**Homeless Management Information System (HMIS):** Computerized data collection app/program designed to capture client-level info on the characteristics/needs of homeless adults/children over time.

**Homelessness:** People without a home.

**Housing Inventory Count:** Report on the number of program beds/housing units available/in use, both, on any given day and overtime.

**Normalization:** Setting a routine structure and system in place where an individual has a familiar environment/surroundings instead of the unpredictable streets.

**OKC:** An abbreviation for Oklahoma City.

**Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH):** Housing combined with support services that have no time limit(s) for homeless persons with a disabling condition.

**Plaza Mayor:** The name of the attempted rebranding and reopening of Crossroads Mall with the intent of becoming a Hispanic Community Center as well in OKC.

**Rough Sleeping:** People sleeping/bedded down, in the open air such as on the streets, in doorways or parks.

**Transitional Housing:** Time limited temporary housing/services for people who have multiple barriers to obtaining housing & employment.

**Sheltered Homeless:** People who are living in a publicly/privately supervised operated shelter designed for temporary living arrangements.

**Unaccompanied Youth:** Person(s) under the age of 25 who are no longer with/supported by/ran away from their parent/legal guardian, lack regular income and have very little means of self-support if any.

**Unsheltered Homeless:** People with a nighttime residence not designed for ordinary use as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.



### INTRODUCTION/PURPOSE

Many commercial shopping malls across the US are failing<sup>1</sup> and shutting down<sup>2</sup> like Crossroads Mall (Plaza Mayor) did in OKC. When they shut down, jobs evaporate and spaces become abandoned leaving large structures without a purpose just sitting there. Constantly repeated in Dr. Gaddie's Architectural Democracy Political Science capstone class during the spring 2018 semester was this phrase: "The meaning, use, function and purpose of space is constantly being redefined and repurposed overtime." These unoccupied<sup>3</sup> malls, once a central space for socializing of economic activity now vacant, need a 21<sup>st</sup> Century repurposing. With investments<sup>4</sup> drying<sup>5</sup> up<sup>6</sup>, many abandoned<sup>7</sup> and homeless<sup>8</sup> populations<sup>9</sup> on the rise<sup>10</sup> across<sup>11</sup> the US, the time is now to save jobs/combat poverty & reduce homelessness is now.

Instead of these jobs dying out and spaces left abandoned they need to be repurposed and given new life to help facilitate thriving communities in modern times to be successful for their day instead of clinging to past models. During the expansions<sup>12</sup> in the 1950's and 1960's malls were starting to pop up in suborn areas reflecting the economic boom and increase in living standards post World War II. During the 1970's, 1980's and 1990's with relative<sup>13</sup> low cost of living having a big store to go to along with a movie theatre and food court to hang out at made sense. It was pre internet sales and instant communication smart phones. The malls became social gathering places and every community wanted one. Basically like the Grand Bazaar in Istanbul famous for its many shops and merchants, the spice markets throughout the Middle East and farmers markets for goods, the mall became the one stop shop. Then when online sales combined with declining income/increased bills came about, the malls started becoming vacant and declining across America. Sitting basically abandoned for a long time in OKC is Cross Roads Mall/Plaza Mayor.<sup>14</sup>

The purpose of this paper will be to review the homeless numbers across Oklahoma City, identify those at risk of becoming homeless or being victim to poverty by system/circumstance and how the space of Cross Roads Mall can be repurposed as a benefit to the community for reduce homelessness/poverty in OKC and develop a model for the rest of the nation to reduce homelessness. In addition many models look to solve the present problem while failing to address future trends such as changes in economic conditions, climate change and immigration/migration patterns. When proposing this model, these factors will be included.

During this time there were really no cell phone, cable and or internet bills combined with very little student loan debt and low monthly payments, so wages which remain flat in present day went further back then along with cheaper prices for the cost of goods thus creating a product buying economy.

## CROSSROADS MALL & PLAZA MAYOR HISTORY

Crossroads opened on February 17, 1974 with major anchor retailers such as John A. Brown, Dillard's, Montgomery Ward and JC Penney. Crossroads Mall was named based on its chosen location at the major intersection of I-35 and I-240, being a transportation hub and crossing of roads in Oklahoma City. At the time it was one of the largest construction projects to have ever taken place in Oklahoma, and one of the ten largest malls in America causing the Daily Oklahoman to declare Crossroads Mall as "the most magnificent enclosed and air-conditioned shopping mall in the Southwest." Crossroads Mall was one of the more popular shopping establishments in OKC for 20+ years. In 2001 Montgomery Ward shut down due to bankruptcy and the declining problems of Crossroads began followed by the four (4) major anchor to store closing in the late 2000s, which sent the majority of its remaining tenants to vacate the mall amplified by the 2008 economic downturn and increased gang activity from jobs leaving the area.

The property was foreclosed on in April 2009 and it fell under the ownership of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York as part of an AIG & Bear Stearns bailout. <sup>18</sup> On September 14, 2011, 762,532 square feet of Crossroads Mall was purchased by Raptor Properties, LLC for \$3.5 million USD. In April 2013, Raptor Properties announced plans to rebrand Crossroads by marketing to the Hispanic community. On April 24, 2013, Raptor

announced that the new name of the mall would be Plaza Mayor and it reopened. They also announced future renovations that would have included space for a grocery store, a nightclub and a rodeo arena seating 3,500 spectators that didn't happen. By 2015 Plaza Mayor went from abandoned to thriving. When it initially reopened under a different name and new management, it only had 17% occupancy rate and by 2015 it had jumped up to 45% occupancy. <sup>19</sup> In 2017 Plaza Mayor appeared within the perception of the OKC Community and the merchants of Plaza Mayor to be thriving. Then a curveball from left field came out of nowhere with no indication of warning in September 2017 that management of ownership announced that Plaza Mayor was closing permanently<sup>20</sup> on October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 (Halloween) leaving a scary and haunted future for the Mall. In September 2019 a few stores sit around the edges and smaller properties such as AMC Crossroads Mall, Texas Road House, a car dealership, an event center, a few motels and some educational outreach centers, however the main mall itself still sits abandoned. Today the site is owned by CRM Properties who is attempting to broker<sup>21</sup> the sale of Plaza Mayor. It sits unused and unoccupied with much interest and competing visions<sup>22</sup> however no action has vet to be taken while the area continues to experience economic declines.

#### ITS FORMS EVERYWHERE









- By 2030, eradicate extreme poverty for all people everywhere, currently measured as people living on less than \$1.25 a day.
- By 2030, reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions.
- Implement nationally appropriate <u>social protection systems and measures for all</u>, including <u>floors</u>, and by 2030 achieve <u>substantial coverage</u> of the poor and <u>the vulnerable</u>.
- By 2030, ensure that all men and women, in particular the poor and *the vulnerable*, *have equal rights to economic resources*, as well as access to basic services, ownership and control over land and other forms of 13 property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology and financial services, including micro-finance.
- By 2030, build the resilience of the poor and <u>those in vulnerable situations</u> and reduce their exposure and vulnerability to climate-related extreme events and other economic, social and environmental shocks and disasters.
- Ensure significant mobilization of resources from a variety of sources, including through enhanced development cooperation, in order to provide adequate and predictable means for developing countries, in particular least developed countries, to implement programmes and policies to end poverty in all its dimensions.
- Create sound policy frameworks at the national, regional and international levels, based on propoor and gender-sensitive development strategies, to support accelerated investment in poverty eradication actions<sup>23</sup>








## CROSSROADS/PLAZA NAYOR MAPS




#### Gender

The percentage of females counted increased slightly from 371 to 387 since 2018. The percentage of males counted saw a larger increase of nearly 8% from 811 to 877. Additionally, 5 transgendered people were identified during the count. Men are less likely to be sheltered than women. In 2018, 34% of all homeless men surveyed were unsheltered compared to 22% of women.




#### **Race and Ethnicity**

While the percentage of respondents identifying as Other/Multiple Races increased from 2018 to 2019, all other groups showed a slight reduction. Only 5 respondents identified as Asian this year which is under 1% of the total homeless population. Additionally, 1 person identified as Pacific Islander. People indicating Hispanic ethnicity accounted for 9%.



#### Age

Though the overall number of invididuals in each age category may fluctuate from year to year, the percentage that each group makes up of the overall total population typically remains fairly stable. On the night of the count, 8 children under the age of 18 years old were found to be sleeping outside.



#### HOMELESSNESS IN OKC A CLOSER LOOK

This year, we wanted to paint a more detailed picture of what homelessness in ORC flooks like. The information bellow was gathered for the first time from people who were unsheltered during the 2019 Point in Time count. Unsheltered means a person living somewhere unfit for human habitation like on the street, in abandoned buildings, in a whicle, or in a park or other public space.





# REDUCING POVERTY & HOMELESSNESS IN OKC

Looking at the current existing known<sup>30</sup> number<sup>31</sup> of homeless in Oklahoma City combined with the anticipated growth population from a projected better living conditions, increased immigration and climate<sup>32</sup> refugees<sup>33</sup> from climate change causing changes to sea levels, increased storm frequency and making once livable areas non unlivable, Oklahoma City will continue to grow in population. Additionally as Oklahoma City's economy presently expands with job increases<sup>34</sup> and the renovations from programs like MAPS<sup>35</sup> I, II & III the city will continue to attract a large number of businesses. Unlike business attractions of past that require low skill labor, most of the new jobs will require<sup>36</sup> a college degree. With the increases in population, job seekers and hopeful climate refugees fleeing, there will be a greater homeless population. Topping off a recent<sup>37</sup> increase<sup>38</sup> in layoffs<sup>39</sup> of low<sup>40</sup> skill jobs combined with the



limited resources of oil<sup>41</sup>, Oklahoma City is on a path for major growth with decaying infrastructure combined with a large population bubble that will need job retraining otherwise it will contribute to a large level of homelessness. City Officials have taken some of the first steps to address these issues which include keeping Oklahoma City Community College, OSU-OKC and Rose State Community College tuition low allowing access to community training and Associate Degrees. Oklahoma City and the surrounding metro areas have some of the best<sup>42</sup> Career and VO Tech's in the country. Also the recent passage<sup>43</sup> of MAPS 4<sup>44</sup> which includes \$50 Million for a Housing First strategy to combat homelessness, \$40 Million for dealing with Mental<sup>45</sup> Illness, \$38 Million for the Family Justice Center by Palomar<sup>46</sup> and \$17 Million for the Diversion Hub<sup>47</sup> will help lessen poverty in OKC. More needs to be done to address homeless poverty issues of today to create next generation capacity for the <u>Best of Both Worlds<sup>48</sup></u>.



### CROSSROADS MALL

The existing Crossroads structure under this proposal would need to be renovated. The proposal would involve splitting the four (4) wings into offices of government satellite agencies creating a one stop shop for people in need of social services. The smallest wing would be turned into a basic medical care unit with counseling services, X ray and basic CDC recommended vaccinations. The third wing would be set up with job training, educational programs and life skills while the largest wing would be converted entirely into housing and processing. The 2<sup>nd</sup> floor would be devoted entirely to housing. In addition this would take advantage of four unique partnerships.



The first of the four partnerships would benefit the 20% of the homeless population in Oklahoma City that doesn't have a High School Diploma or GED by proposing a partnership with Santa Fe High School in the local area to have some of the teachers teach and administer the program. The second would be with Hudiburg Auto Group given their location to sell and finance used cars as a center project for low income individuals and the recent homeless transitioning back into non homeless life while having transportation opportunities for both gaining and keeping employment. This would also help the 61% of OKC homeless who currently walk. For those looking to obtain a college degree the center could partner with both

Rose State and Oklahoma City Community to help obtain and facilitate access. The fourth partnerships would be with local businesses needing to hire people in which case they would call up the job training center, say I need you to teach/train these skills, upon completion of the class swoop in and hire these trained individuals. In addition the center would be a location that all officers could take the homeless to and get them processed. This would also help to solve problems one and two out of five of the most common reason why homeless people didn't stay in the shelters between being full or too crowded. In addition as the Vatican<sup>49</sup> has pushed continually across Italy to install showers in public restrooms for the homeless, each housing unit in the proposed design would have a miny shower.

Another issue that arises for the homeless and those in poverty seeking employment is obtaining access to government ID's. Under this proposal the processing center on the first floor within the housing wing would include a City of Oklahoma City issued idea that could be made in house and then fingerprinted and added into a city database as to identify the homeless. In addition the homeless could rent PO Boxes assigned at this location so they have a physical mailing address for when seeking employment. On top of the existing shelters, this would greatly increase the current capacity available shelter spaces.

#### HOUSING FIRST

Recently a trend has started to take hold in research on homelessness as housing first which basically states in order to address the problem, you first give someone a stable home and then work on medication, therapy, counseling and education. This trend has also expanded to education with safety and full stomach first before learning. As of Nov 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 (last checked on Dec 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019) there are 1064 abandoned<sup>50</sup> buildings/residences<sup>51</sup> unused and being unoccupied in Oklahoma City. With the proper renovation it is theoretically possible (since some homeless are family) to give each of the current 1,273 a home. However since they are various locations across the cities and the efficiency apartments being built are separate units far away from the services, it doesn't make sense to do this as a first step. Instead housing first should be done with the shelter along with the services and as people gain more Indepence have these independent homes along with a car loan program from job skills to transition them into nicer living conditions and work their way up.
